School Safety

The staff at CCM would like to assure you that we take precautions every day to ensure the safety of each person who walks through our doors.

- All doors leading to our school are to be locked unless a staff member is present (arrival and dismissal are the only times they are unlocked).
- Outside arrival/dismissal times, all visitors are required to buzz in the front door. If the person is not recognized, whoever is at the front desk goes to the door to gain information about the visitor before they are allowed in.
- Students are not released to adults without appropriate dismissal cards or ID (and then only after parent request).
- All visitors should wear badges during school hours.
- All doors are in the locked position during the day so when they are closed, they are locked.
- We participate in lockdown, fire and tornado drills and discuss procedures to follow with our students. These events * are debriefed at meetings and through Weekly Updates.
- A "safety audit" was completed today (February 28th) with only minor suggestions being made. Those were addressed immediately.
- The Frederick County SWAT Team held a practice exercise at CCM which gave them first-hand knowledge of our school.
- Staff members have walkie talkies when they are outside and at all times when they are with students to communicate with the office.
- Whether they are inside or outside, our staff is very aware of "strangers" in and around our parking lot and report any concerns to the office immediately.
- There is a plan in place if it ever becomes necessary to evacuate the building.
- Safety plans are reviewed annually as well as during collaboration and staff meetings as needed. Page 2





From the Art Room



Primary students continue to explore the element of line as they practice gesture and contour drawings while working from the still-life. Using ink and bamboo brushes, the children are also practicing their painted lines as they observe the still-life. After developing abstract printmaking works about line, the children will move on to works about the element of shape.

Lower Elementary students have just completed the very long process of incorporating book binding, printmaking and photography to create hand bound books that explore leaves and their shapes. I hope these beautiful works have made their way home with your children and that they have been able to share them with you. We are now using the animals of the Chinese Zodiac as

inspiration for drawing and sculpting animals and understanding animal symbology. Upper Elementary students have completed their architectural sculptures with spray paint and are either displaying the finished pieces in the library or taking them home. Since some students worked in groups for this project, not everyone will bring a piece home. Some groups have opted to display the works in the library as a way of sharing them. Currently, the children are learning about the Japanese tradition of Gyotaku printmaking. This method of printmaking began in the mid-1800s when fisherman made prints of their catches to record them.



Middle School Sculpture students are completing their architectural sculptures and beginning a project in clay. Informed and inspired by Chinese ceramics, the children are creating a coil pot that emulates a ceramic piece from a period in Chinese history of their choice.

Middle School Oil Painting students are using color to create space as they work from the still-life and developing their 16" x 20" paintings of their choice. Currently, 9"x 12", Precisionist oil paintings from the first semester are being displayed.

Music Notes

Kindergarten music classes have continued to practice using the solfeggio hand signs in their greeting song as well as practicing the signs for the major scale. Our Spanish valentine song, Te Quiero, worked students' alternating hand skills as they begin learning movements for playing maracas in later years. We used the Montessori bells to accompany the Chinese New Year song, Gung Hay Fat Choy, using a whole note pattern , while the Brush Your Teeth song got a lot of giggles as we played shakers to emulate the sound of a tooth brush in honor of Dental Health Month. We say good bye to our "Freeze" dance as February comes to a close.

Lower Elementary classes used the tone bars to practice identifying notes on the treble clef and to accompany another Chinese New Year song, "Ring in the New Year" in the pentatonic scale. The brass family has been an exciting group of instruments to study, as students learn what which one has been playing familiar melodies in Star Wars, Mario, and the Olympics. Classes continue to "sight-read" hand signs in more difficult interval skipping exercises of solfeggio.

Upper Elementary recorder study has begun with veteran students coaching our "newbies" on articulation, fingering, and posture. Our featured directed listening piece, "Conga del Fuego Nuevo" by Arturo Marquez, provided a timely demonstration of Latin Percussion found in orchestral music, especially for claves. Students are continuing the study of sixteenth notes by combining them with eighth notes and performing complicated rhythm patterns.

Middle School

We now have a drama class once a week that has several students channeling their inner thespian drive into skits and pantomimes. This month focused on drama vocabulary, emphasis, good actor traits, and blocking.

Independent study continues on guitar and keyboard, with some students trying out mandolin and ukulele as well. For veteran students, classical repertoire has become their focus as they study selections such as Fur Elise, Minuet in G, and Sarabonde.

Physical Education

Primary students have been busy learning how to volley an object consecutively. Students have been practicing using a balloon individually and with a group keeping it up and volleying to other students. Primary students have also been working with long-handled implements practicing safety and proper form for shooting and passing. Movement is always a big part of our primary classroom and our primary students are always moving!



LE, UE, and Middle school have all begun their volleyball unit. Students have learned the basic rules of the game, multiple passing techniques, and serving. Students had the opportunity to practice the skills through small group activities over the past week and now we have our net up and are ready for play! Students know the rotation of the players on the court which makes for quick transitions, so everyone has equal opportunity on the court. Students have adapted to our smaller court and have played some great games so far! The weather is getting warmer and we have been taking advantage of getting outside and being active whenever we can. Looking forward to next month students will be focusing on fitness testing and *Mr. Hickman*

Spanish Spoken Here

Kindergarten lessons have been all about the weather. Students started learning about weather conditions: It's cold, it's hot, it's windy, etc. Then we moved to learn about the seasons, and now are learning the months of the year and how they tie to the seasons.

In **Lower Elementary** we have spent the time learning vocabulary and increasing listening comprehension through the unit of Goldilocks and the three bears. We'll continue with this story a little longer. At the end of this unit, students should be able to complete a mini book about this story all in Spanish. Lower Elementary students were also able to go outside when the temperature was 80° and play cultural Spanish games: Telefono roto (telephone), El gato y el ratón (cat and mouse) and Color colorcito (color tag). All of this games were played in Spanish and are popular games played by children in many Hispanic countries.



With **Upper Elementary** we are review greetings, introductions and goodbyes in formal and familiar ways. We are focusing in practicing conversations. Upper Elementary and Middle School students also learned about New York and it's Hispanic community. We

also talked about and watched part of the Hispanic Day Parade celebrated in that city. The students also learned about the Latino Festival celebrated yearly in Frederick.

Middle School is also getting a review of formal and familiar ways to greet, introduce yourself or someone else, and say good bye. We have also gone over the alphabet, discussing both pronunciation and names of letters. Finally, we have reviewed also the names and location of Spanish Speaking countries on the map.

Culture learning: In the past weeks, *Carnavales* were celebrated all around the world. All students learned the meaning of the word *Carnaval* and the reason carnivals are celebrated in February (The last feast before Lent). Lower Elementary students "prepared" for the celebration by creating a mask of an iconic figure of *Carnaval de Barranquilla* (Colombia) called *La Marimonda*.



Montessori News

Teachers from public Montessori schools across Maryland will be meeting this month to begin a collaboration that will strengthen Montessori across the state for all students. Several members of our staff will be joining educators from Baltimore and Prince George's County to discuss how we can share resources and build on the strengths of each of our programs. Bringing these educators together will allow us to be better advocates for our Montessori schools.

If you have not already contacted your delegates advocating for the House and Senate Bill (http://mgaleg.maryland.gov/webmga/ frmMain.aspx? pid=billpage&stab=01&id=hb1002&tab= subject3&ys=2018RS) allowing public Montessori schools to hire teachers who hold a Montessori certificate without having a Maryland teaching license please consider doing so (http:// mgaleg.maryland.gov/webmga/ frmmain.aspx? pid=legisrpage&tab=subject6). The Montessori certification requirements meet and often exceed the expectations of a state

teaching license. This bill would

require a teacher who has a Montessori certificate from an accredited

training center to also pass the PRAXIS exam and take two college classes (special education and a reading class). These bills will be heard March 7th and 8th and have the potential of providing students with teachers in their Montessori classrooms that are qualified to teach using the Montessori philosophy from the day they are hired. This is an exciting step for Montessori in the state of Maryland!
