It finally happened. We had been sailing along with one or two cases of COVID that happened away from school and then it happened. Last week we had multiple positive cases of COVID. Our staff completed contact tracing and made sure we contained all exposures as much as possible. If your child does not feel well, please keep them home. Please have them tested for COVID if they have those symptoms before sending them to school. Please be aware that FCPS does not accept at home test results.





Thank you to everyone who supported our middle school by purchasing plants. On the surface this might have looked like a nice fundraising activity. The students put so much into this endeavor. They propagated the plants, caring for them throughout the fall. A marketing plan was developed. The students secured "loans" of items such as soil and clay and will be reimbursing people for those expenses. They had to determine appropriate prices for each variety of plant. There was the set up and take down of the actual sale. It has been a joy to observe our students work collaboratively and in their various work groups to plan and make their first micro-economy activity a success.

The lottery opens the day after we come back to school after winter break. Do you remember entering the lottery for your child(ren)? I know the anxious time between when you enter and when the actual lottery is pulled first hand from our grandson going through this in Indiana. If you have children who are not currently attending CCM and you would like for them to join us next year, you must enter them in the lottery. If you know family or friends who have children who are interested in our school, please share lottery <u>information</u> with them (this website will be updated when the lottery goes live January 4th).

We will be saying good-bye to Mrs. McIntosh as our middle school math/science teacher as winter break begins. She has been an anchor of our middle school since that class opened. She has written grants for our students to participate in wonderful field trip. Her instruction has included math classes to meet the needs of students including algebra and geometry in addition to traditional middle school math. I often look up from my computer and see her singing or dancing or enjoying jokes with her students. She will be missed. We are so amazingly fortunate that Dr. Welch, who has been the assistant in middle school this year, will be stepping into this position. Dr. Welch has a PhD in Forensic Biology. Her bachelors is in Biology (with honors) and she has a post graduate certificate in advanced academic studies. Her science background is, logically, heavily grounded in math. Dr. Welch has taught at the university level so our students will be well taken care of for sure!

Counselors Corner

We continue supporting students with a variety of needs related to academics and social-emotional wellbeing at school. Our goal as school counselors is to be able to connect with each student at CCM. This month we focused on individual student support including; academic strategies, problem solving, coping skills, etc. We have found the need to prioritize the topic of peer conflict for our January classroom lessons.

What to Know:

We are jumping back into **testing** after Winter Break! Here are some tips to discuss with your students at home...

- Help your student with a nighttime and morning routine that will ensure they are well rested and prepared for the school day. This includes that they eat a good breakfast (at home or at school) and they are on time for school.
- Discuss and practice calming strategies at home so students can see what may help them if they are feeling nervous and/or frustrated. Ex. Deep breathing.
- Remember testing is just one piece of information we use to help plan for your students' education. Just do your best.

Attendance is very important and can be confusing! Please contact Kathleen McNamara with questions or concerns at (240)566-0627. If your student is absent you need to notify the school via the attendance email (ccms.attendance@fcps.org) or by physical note to Ms. Anderson. Student absences are only excused if we are provided a lawful reason for absence (ex. Illness, doctor's note for illness and appts., 5 days vacation, death in the family, COVID, etc.) within 48 hours of student absence. We will also take early notification!

From the Art Room



Kindergarten students are learning about the Principle of Art, pattern, the tradition of quilt making in North America, and the contemporary, fine art quilts of Faith Ringgold. The children are practicing pattern and color theory by creating warm/cool patterns in the shape of their favorite quilt block design.



Lower Elementary students are reviewing the elements of art as they build on the paper sculpture techniques that they learned last year and create paper sculptures that emphasize line variety, the value scale, and form.

Upper Elementary students are applying their oil pastel skills to large artworks inspired by a variety of North American artists.



Middle School Sculpture students are painting slab pots, finishing coil skill builders, and creating pots for their micro economy.

Middle School Drawing and Painting students are completing their Wayne <u>Thiebaud</u> inspired still-life paintings.

Music Notes

MUSIC NOTES

Kindergarten classes have been working on a sound scape (using various instruments as a story is told) to the book, "Fletcher and the Falling Leaves." Students played the stir xylophone, chimes, bass xylophone, and other instruments as characters and sound effects. Students also explored playing many different types of bells while singing Jingle Bells. Our December dances included the Freeze Dance and Hanukkah is Here.



Lower Elementary students have started to learn a crossover technique on the barred instruments while singing "Salamanca Market," using xylophones, metallophones, and glockenspiels. Our holiday songs included Ocho Kandelikas, Feliz Navidad, O Hanukkah Dance, and Winter Fantasy.



Upper Elementary students have expanded their use of the barred (orff) instruments as they play accompaniment patterns to Ocho Kandelikas, Charlie Brown, and Feliz Navidad. Students are also using their knowledge of sixteenth and eighth note rhythm values to compose melodies to the Click Beetle rhythm rhyme. Our Upper Elementary classes are especially skilled at playing together as ensembles; one class even performed for their teachers!

Middle School

<u>Percussion</u>: students are studying mallet technique using the Crossover drills and playing complicated melody patterns from Blue Ramble, a 6 part orff arrangement with drums.

<u>Performing Ensemble</u>: our Middle School ensemble entertained close family at our first winter concert in 2 years! Audience members sang along as we celebrated being together again. We were fortunate to include 6th grade members, as well!

Elementary Performing Ensemble: a fabulous time was had by close family members attending our first concert in 2 years!

Spanish Spoken Here


Please read below to learn about what students have been working on in my classes during the last month:

Montessori Spanish Experience – MSE students learned about Spain's
 Lotería de Navidad, the biggest lottery in the world. Students reviewed
 how to write and say numbers in the thousands, tens of thousands,
 and millions and then used those numbers in our own mini-lottery.
 They did Movie Talk, Listen and Draw, and Read & Match exercises to
 dive into two authentic (and sappy!) commercials from Spain that
 promote the lottery as well as the importance of giving. Students then
 wrote informational essays in Spanish to explain the Spanish lottery
 tradition and to compare and contrast the two commercials.



- MS Spanish 2 Students in this class explored vocabulary and grammar structures to describe family
 celebrations and special foods. Students also explored Thanksgiving trivia in Spanish and created their own
 card sets for the game *Cucharas*/Spoons with the theme of family celebrations and gifted them to a
 classmate. We also explored language to read and talk about sports, including a story about a talented
 young baseball player who, despite not having support from his family at first, chose to become a dancer
 after watching <u>TikTok</u> and Instagram dance videos. Students took a midterm exam consisting of reading,
 listening, writing, and speaking sections and overall performance was fantastic!
- MS & 6th Grade Spanish 1 Spanish 1 students learned terms related to taking classes, speaking a language, and studying for a career (toma, habla, quiere ser). They used their understanding of these key terms to explore the unique whistle language of Gomera Island, one of Spain's Canary Islands. Students took a midterm writing assessment that required them to use high-frequency language we have learned so far this year to describe a picture story. Students did a wonderful job using use their knowledge of Spanish vocabulary and grammar to independently compose their own stories.
- Upper Elementary A As part of our class novel, Llama en Lima, UE-A students tackled an authentic
 resource Spanish infograph about llamas including their uses and unique physiology. Students read the next
 chapter of our book and followed that with several games and writing works to show their comprehension
 and make predictions for the next chapter.

What are we doing this month? Kindergarten & Early Elementary

Extra Notes:

As the weather starts to cool, we have moved into an indoor striking unit with an emphasis on volleyball and the newest popular activity, modified Gaga Ball. Gaga Ball focuses on striking a beach ball or vinyl ball with the hand in a sidearm movement. Gaga ball also allows students to focus on agility and footwork. It has quickly become a class favorite with all levels of students.

Yoga is an excellent way to practice balance, body control and awareness. Kindergarten and lower elementary students have been working on yoga poses in general space and moving between poses in a modified Vinyasa. I am so excited to see the students move through their poses with such focus and determination. We have some very experienced "yogees" here at CCM. They are teaching me just as much as I am teaching them. :)


