Principals Message

Fall is here and with it has come busy, busy times at CCM. Parent/Teacher conferences are later this month which will give our teachers time to share with you the progress your child has made so far this year. We are looking forward to spending this time with you. We recognize the extra effort it takes during conference week to adjust to the change in schedule and truly appreciate each family's dedication to our school as a whole as we provide opportunities to make these connections. Lunch will be served each day for those students who would like to have lunch at school. Breakfast will also be served on Friday of conference week. Our P3 students will not come to school on conference days.

Maria Montessori was a true scientist who observed children in their enviroment and through these observations and research developed the philosophy and methodology we use today in Montessori schools. The adults in a Montessori learning environment provide opportunities for children to learn at their own pace and interest while ensuring they reach the expectations of the county and state. Children can not learn everything while inside a building which is why we work to take field trips that connect to the learning that is being done in the classroom while building confidence and independence. Classes have already gone camping and gone to Tree Trekkers, and Upward Enterprises. We have also had parents visit to share about their home countries which has been amazing! As you can see in the calendar, there are many learning and preparation by the adults is has a multitude of benefits for our students. Thank you for supporting these experiences outside our building!

The beginning of school has also had celebrations that have reminded us of our connections to each other as well as our environment. Maria Montessori's birthday was celebrated in classes August 31st and International Day of Peace was September 21st. Each classroom honored Maria Montessori in their classrooms, but we were able to gather together outside for our first assembly of the year for the International Day of Peace celebration. Every student had a part in presentations during the ceremony with the middle school music ensemble accompaning the student body as the event ended with "Light a Candle for Peace" in both English and Spanish. Such a lovely tradition! Our students participated in community service activities such as the middle school students sprucing up our school grounds and using chalk to send peaceful messages to those who enter the building. An upper elementary class did an amazing job cleaning up the Peace Garden and added some new flowers. One of our lower elementary classes tidying yup our grounds each Friday!



Our Governing Council and our non-profit organization, Monocacy Montessori Communities, Incoprorated, have been working deligently on facilities over the past several months. Please welcome Mrs. James as our new addition to the School Counseling team! Mrs. James was a school counselor/student support specialist for seven years before staying home with her two children.

Originally from Winchester, VA, Mrs. James and her husband relocated to downtown Frederick in 2013. In addition to supporting students, Mrs. James enjoys gardening, bike riding and crafting. She looks forward to getting to know the students and families of CCM!

As school counselors, we will be holding small groups with students that focus on specific needs and skills.We continue to teach a lesson in each classroom, once a month. Our September lessons varied topics dependent upon grades, which included; identifying and expressing emotions/feelings in primary, self-esteem in lower elementary, bullying in upper elementary, and suicide prevention in middle school. Our October lessons will cover new topics.



We meet with students individually to listen to their needs, offer advice or support, to work through peer issues, and/or support them in advocating for themselves. In the month of September we have worked through several situations that required discussions about bullying and being inclusive of others.



As School Counselors we use brief-solution focused counseling, as the goal is to help students get to a place where they can learn. Outside of this individual counseling, we are able to offer outside resources for further supports upon parent request or need.

We support our school with the following; Attendance, 504s, Community and Homeless Liaison, Testing Coordinator, High School Registration, etc.

Music Notes

Kindergarten classes are continuing to focus on classroom routine, extending now to using some of our most basic instruments. Students are using egg shakers to accompany the chicken song and "La Vaca Lola." Students have enjoyed playing "Hunt the Cows," requiring them to take turns as the rooster to wake everyone else up.



Lower Elementary students are using African dance moves to "perform" fishing stories they

have written for creative movement. They follow the drum pattern, and chant expressive phrases for events in the story while performing specific movements to represent walking, casting a net, and carrying fish to market. Classes are now singing "Fish n Chips" in a three part round, with 3rd graders, and even some 2nd graders being section leaders!



Upper Elementary classes have been exploring African instruments. Students have used gankogui, shekere, take, djembes, and talking drums to play multi-rhythm drumming arrangements, call and response, and improvisational activities. Students are also brushing up on note reading skills to prepare for playing the recorder. If your child still needs to purchase

one, log into their schoolcash online account and look for the UE recorder option.

Middle School

- Music History class has just finished the Blues unit, with students composing and playing their own 12 Bar Blues compositions
- Drama class has been exploring 3 word skits, Fairy Tale Tableaus, and looking at the silent movie genre and how facial expressions told the stories
- Performing Ensemble: our Peace Assembly performance was fantastic! Students will now focus on their Winter Concert selections for December 15.

¡Hola familias de CCM!

Happy Hispanic Heritage Month! This nationally recognized month runs from September 15 to October 15 every year. We honor Hispanic cultures every day in class at CCM, but this month is a time to engage in special learning opportunities. Please read below to learn about what students have been working on in my classes.

- Montessori Spanish Experience MSE has been exploring the true story of a teacher from Colombia
 named Luis Soriano who created a traveling library to bring much-needed books to children in his rural
 community. Since road travel isn't very easy in the mountainous areas where he lives, he uses his two
 donkeys! Students have been working on retelling the story of "El Biblioburro" in their own words in
 Spanish. This class will have a field trip coming up in early November, so please stay tuned for info on
 that!
- MS Spanish 2 Spanish 2 is currently exploring language related to "comidas tradicionales" or traditional foods of Spanish-speaking countries. We also learned about how changing demographics are affecting the "American" diet and influencing the types of foods and flavors available in US markets. We also have several food preparation activities in the coming weeks, so that is exciting!



- MS Spanish 1 This class has just finished a unit of study on how to introduce oneself and others (forms of *llamarse*) and how to express likes and dislikes (forms of *gustar*). They have also learned how to use the high-frequency grammar structures of *dice/says*, *hay/there is or there are*, and *es/is* in both the positive and negative forms. They have worked on listening to simple Spanish stories that use these structures and retelling the main ideas in English, and they have also started to use our core grammar and vocabulary to write simple Spanish sentences.
- 6th Grade Spanish 1 6th grade Spanish 1 has been ramping up their abilities in Spanish writing and

CUENTOS EN ESPAÑOL speaking while using language acquired last year. Together the class co-created a story using a "choose your own adventure" inspired lesson. They then had to retell the important parts of the story in their own words. In another output-focused work, students were given a series of images that told a story, but the students had to write the story themselves and present it in Spanish. They used

language from last year including forms of va a/goes to, está + feeling word/is feeling ____, tiene/has, le gusta/likes, descubre que/discovers that, quiere ser/wants to be, dice/says, ve/sees, and others.

Upper Elementary Spanish A – Upper Elementary group A had a quick review of language used to
express calendar and time. We also reviewed language used to introduce self and others, express likes
and dislikes, and describe who is talking or asking questions in present and past tenses (forms of
llamarse, forms of gustar, *dice, dijo, pregunta, preguntó*).

It is hard to believe that we have made it to the middle of the quarter! It has been so much fun getting to know all the new students and to re-connect with old ones watching them learn so much even in this short time.

We have been celebrating el Mes de la Herencia Hispana; so far, we learned about Colombia; its culture, traditions, music, some food and all the wonderful things this country has to offer.

In Primary class the kids have been working really hard in understanding basic commands and getting used to the new language they have being exposed with songs, games, videos, reading and dancing, is important for them to move and to associate the movement with the words in the songs.



In Lower Elementary, we are identifying and recognizing cognates associate with our unit, we have learned some new words and watch a little story about Colombia and why it's a colorful country, also we have learned about a very interesting mode of transportation call CHIVA.

In Upper L, the students have been making a big effort in understanding all the information about Colombia, is important for the students to be exposed as much as possible to the Spanish language getting a clear input in their level so they can output the information in a clear and understanding way, this is why we have been reading and watching videos in Spanish and answering questions about the subject.

The next week we will continue learning about more Latino culture and this time it's Puerto Rico's turn. We will dive into its culture, music and traditions. It will look a lot like our study of Colombia. Our goal is to focus on the culture of these countries, more than on famous celebrities and people, Latino culture is so filled with traditions and history that we have enjoyed introducing the kids to these beautiful places!

What are we doing this month?

Kindergarten & Early Elementary

- Team Building exercises focusing on locomotor movements
- Introduction to "playground games" (4-square, gaga ball, chain tag)
- Introduction to beginner cues for throwing and catching

Upper Elementary and Middle

- Introduction to ultimate football; throwing and catching
- Station work focusing on skill related components of fitness (balance, agility ladder, standing long jump, auditory and visual reaction time)
- Fitness: dynamic vs static stretching (warm up and cool down)

Extra Notes:

It has been a fantastic start to the school year! Students are beginning to work together in cooperative games and activities promoting teamwork and collaboration. All classes have been reintroduced to the PE classroom expectations and rules. We will continue to focus on developmental fitness at the upper elementary and middle school levels. The lower elementary and kindergarten classes have been progressing well with locomotor movements, pathways, and levels.

The month of October will focus upon the basic cues for throwing and catching. All levels will participate in games and activities that promote throwing and catching skills while also focusing on teamwork and cooperation. The upper elementary and middle school classes will be going outside as we work in our ultimate football unit. The lower elementary and kindergarten classes will be introduced to throwing and catching with various manipulatives (small and large foam balls, bean bags, foam discs, and small inflatable playground balls). We will work on throwing to a target at multiple levels as well.
